- 1. Approval of 11.24.20 Meeting Minutes (Page 2) APPROVED
- 2. Chemistry and Language Policy Proposal presented by Mark Collyer and Kerri Wakefield (Page 3). Overall goal of the proposed chemistry and language policies is to align CoE with LSA and other U-M schools/colleges. Chemistry proposed policy consist of two parts; first, students need to score 3+ on the AP CHEM exam to earn credit for CHEM 130/125/126 and second, students who earn AP CHEM credit are exempt from the Chemistry Placement Exam. Most of committee voiced approval of part one; however, concerns were expressed about part two. Vote has been tabled until February meeting to allow time for committee members to discuss with their departments and for Kerri and Mark to gather additional data regarding student performance. Language proposed policy is to suspend the practice of granting credit for language exam scores. Most members expressed being in favor of policy. Request made to revise pdf to include wording regarding retro-active credit policy for language departments that provide credit to student who complete a higher-level language course. Vote tabled until February meeting to allow time for committee members to discuss with their departments.
- 3. Supplemental Studies Program Policies presented by Susan Montgomery (Page 8). Betsy Dodge presented for Susan Montgomery and shared Susan's recommended adjustments and highlighted item #8 which requires input from the committee. Opinions were expressed that language in item #7 needs to be changed for purposes of consistency with item #8. Also question raised about what is meant by requirements in item #7. It was requested that members bring the policy back to their departments for review/discussion and we will revisit for purposes of making changes during February meeting.
